a. **NJROTC Continuing Instructional Plan**

In response to the Continuing Instructional Plan the NJROTC unit cadets will be assigned the NJROTC ACT Test prep program. This is a test preparation web site made available by the Navy JROTC program.

Cadets will log on to our Cocke County NJROTC web site: [www.Cockecountynjrotc.com](http://www.Cockecountynjrotc.com) and click on the KNOWLEDGE tab at the top of the screen. The drop down tab "JROTC College Prep" will take the cadet to the ACT prep program log-in or registration screen. Cadets will establish their own account (cost free) and begin the program.

The NJROTC instructors have the capability to monitor cadet's progress and can assist if problems arise.

**COL Ivory will monitor those who have logged in and are completing work.**
